



CFANS DIVERSITY SCHOLARS

The College of Food, Agricultural and Natural Resource Sciences (CFANS) is committed to increasing the number of underrepresented students of color and indigenous students applying to CFANS graduate programs, as well as the enrollment and retention rates of those graduate students. To help achieve a more diverse and inclusive faculty and student community, the CFANS Diversity Scholars Program offers fellowships to students of color. African American/Black, Native American/Alaskan Native, Chicano/Latinx/Hispanic, or Asian American/Pacific Islander graduate students are encouraged to apply.

CFANS Diversity Scholars – Graduate Student Fellowship

will fund 13 one-year scholarships for incoming underrepresented students who enroll in one of the 12 CFANS graduate programs. Professional development activities are covered by the award.

Deadline to apply for a 2019-2020 fellowship is December 21, 2018.

CFANS Diversity Scholars – Postdoctoral Fellowship

is an initiative to attract promising scholars of color and indigenous students with potential to pursue future faculty positions at the University of Minnesota and at other top research universities. Postdoctoral scholars are intended to closely align with CFANS areas of strength and where we anticipate future faculty growth. Scholars work with CFANS faculty on independent research and participate in professional development in academia, such as teaching and learning, competitive grant writing, supervision of students and staff, and research program development. The program positions them for success in future tenure-track academic positions.

Deadline to apply for a 2019-2021 fellowship is January 11, 2019.
